Course Topics

Russian Grammar Intensive

A structured introduction to Russian grammar system, its sections, etymology, current trends and potential future development as well as the ways to explain and introduce the main concept to others.

Verbs of Motion without prefixes

This topic targets participants' comprehension of one of the most complex parts of Russian grammar. The course boost participants' own competence and provides with insight on how to explain this difficult but important grammar to others.

Verbs of Motion with prefixes

An understanding of verbs of motion with prefixes takes a Russian learner to another level of language competence. These verbs form a significant and complex layer in Russian grammar that stretches to other sections. These sessions explore the subject and give practical advice on how to present, structure, and explain this grammar.

Verbal Government

Verbal government is a corner stone of Russian syntax. Participants' own skills are developed through an in-depth comparative analysis.

Verbal Aspects

If a foreigner ever masters the verbal aspects he is considered absolutely fluent in Russian. This section of Russian grammar poses the biggest problem for students of all nationalities at any level of Russian. The lessons offer a systematic approach to explaining and implementing these skills, and as an outcome the participants have a clear structured system of verbal aspects.

Difficult Cases of Russian Grammar

The topic presents and explains the most complex and difficult cases of Russian grammar.

Course Content and Strategies

This special programme concentrates on general Russian and Russian grammar. It aims to equip participants with a deep understanding of grammar as well as to give them a chance to exercise and refine their own command of the language. The observation and examination of a teaching methodology from a student's perspective also aims at boosting the methodical skills of the participant.

The Grammar Course involves mini-group tuition for anyone wishing to develop their language skills and improve their own proficiency in Russian grammar. Professionals lead the lessons. Communicative approach is used; only Russian is spoken in a classroom. Participants test the teaching methods by peer group work. The small size of the afternoon group gives participants the opportunity to be engaged in conversations, practising and consolidating the new material.

Participants on the Russian Intensive Language + Grammar course can also observe Liden & Denz classes being taught by experienced, qualified RFL teachers. These classes include both short stay and long stay students.
