Course Topics

Teaching without Intermediary Language / Usage of communicative approach

These techniques require a skilful and creative teacher and produce relatively fast progress in forming pragmatic linguistic skills.

Proficiency grids and standards in teaching Russian as a Foreign Language

These are not simply ways of describing the students' level but also checklists and diagnostic tools to help teachers adjust the syllabus.

Vocabulary building methods at various levels of knowledge

How to choose the right way to introduce new vocabulary to multinational groups of students at different competency levels? The most effective, creative, and useful methods available.

Interactive methods

Language is about communicating. Spoken production and overall spoken interaction are the main goals of learning a language, and interactive methods such as picture prompt, discussion groups, total physical response, problem based learning etc. help involve students and boosts language pragmatic competence.

Games and role-plays

A practical session on games used as icebreakers, revision, review and discussion starters. Role-play teaching suggestions targeting each language aspect – job interview, jury trial, role reversion etc. Methods of moderating the role-play and implementing it in the syllabus.

Online resources

Setting the teacher's role in a modern classroom encouraging students to use online/video resources both as self study material and as an essential part of the learning process. Practical advice and technologies of turning a live TV show/documentary/news extract into a versatile and meaningful lesson related to the syllabus.

Pronunciation and Intonation

The importance of practice in this area of linguistic production is explained. An awareness of pronunciation and intonation is instrumental in improving listening ability and making oneself understood. No matter how good grammatical competence, knowledge of vocabulary and overall fluency are,

misunderstandings can occur if there

are pronunciation problems.

Course Content and Strategies

General Russian Course is designed to improve participants' own command of Russian and boost their language competence. We have developed an eclectic teaching philosophy combining many aspects of the communicative approach with structured learning of grammar and syntax. Homework is set each day to practise and consolidate the day's work and to enable all the students to progress as effectively as possible. Each student's progress is being monitored through weekly progress tests; end of course test, and self-evaluation/tutorial sessions with the Head teacher (on demand).

The special afternoon programme concentrates on methodology and individual needs. It aims to equip non-native teachers in secondary and primary education with ideas and materials that can be used with their own students.

Lessons are led by professionals and are designed to give an insight into current language teaching methodology and techniques.

Participants can also observe Liden & Denz classes being taught by experienced & qualified native-speaker teachers of Russian.
