Objectives

The intention is to equip those working with French with general language and communication skills valid for use in educational, social and vocational contexts.

This course involves small group teaching, allowing concentrated, thorough study of French, and develops all aspects of the language - listening, speaking, reading and writing. The course will develop the participants' language skills to help increase their abilities to teach and communicate in French efficiently and successfully.

Course Areas

Activities, games, role plays and various tasks will build a lively basis for students to develop the different skills needed when learning a language:

Listening skills

Students will become confident in understanding in order to process information rapidly

Speaking skills

In our small groups students are given the opportunity of practising language structures and expressing ideas. Afternoon lessons focus on oral communication skills

Reading skills

Practicing reading with or in front of other students will help develop the accurate skills to read effectively.

Writing skills

Writing skills will be practised in class or as homework to develop accuracy in different conditions

Grammar

Grammar will be presented and practised at all levels for a better grasp of the language structures and thus improve fluency

Culture

From the beginning students learn different aspects of French life and culture as they progress in their knowledge of the language.

Course Content and Strategies

Our approach develops all aspects of French -listening, speaking, reading and writing. Classes are offered at 6 levels, from elementary to advanced, each with a maximum of 10 students.

The morning teacher is also the class tutor and he is responsible for class progress and academic welfare. Homework is set and student progress is discussed at the weekly Teachers' Meeting. Students have regular tutorials with their teachers to discuss their progress and ways to maximise their learning
