This course is aimed at non-native speakers of French teaching

- EP5 <u>Students aged 11 19 (Secondary and Vocational Schools)</u>
- EP6 Pupils aged 4 11 (Nursery, Primary Schools)
- EP7 French in Adult Language School (Tours Langues)

Particularly suitable for teachers of non-linguistic subjects (e.g. Maths, Science, P.E. etc.) Suitable for teachers of foreign languages, especially FLE teachers A unique and practical opportunity for the professional development of teachers of CLIL

Objectives

This course is aimed at providing non-native speakers of French with insights into their own and colleagues' teaching practice in a pan-European context by means of one to seven weeks' practical attachment in an appropriate French school, preceded by a one-week or a two-week course of linguistic/cultural preparation.

Methodology

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1 Week: Preparatory Linguistic / Cultural Course: Interactive French language (classroom) sessions, combining a range of input modes, encouraging participants to contribute their own research and experience. Special session involving linguistic and cultural support for the School Attachment.

1-2 Weeks: School Attachment: (5 full days per week, excluding Bank Holidays) - guided observations, shadowing the Host Teacher, directed tasks, team teaching and assignments.

School Attachment Specific Preparation

- Each Applicant completes a detailed Application Form including teaching background.
- Each Applicant completes a detailed professional Needs Analysis.
- Each Applicant completes a detailed Child Safeguarding and Identity Form
- All professional /safeguarding details are checked.
- Each Applicant obtains a copy of their national Criminal Record.
 - Detailed written advice is given to the teacher on obtaining a copy of their Criminal Record.
- Each Record is checked before departure.
- These details are sent to the Host School.
- Detailed written advice is given to the teacher on the School Attachment.
- Detailed advice on the School Attachment is given to the Host School
- Great care and professional expertise is taken in in "matching" visiting teacher and host school

Bi-Component Programme Support

- Each participant has a one-week or two-week Preparatory Course
- Each participant is given a personal TL Tutor to prepare their School Attachment with cultural, educational and practical guidance.
- There is a "Training Officer" in the host school. (Head Teacher, Assistant Head Teacher, Head of Department, International Officer or Training Manager)
- Each participant has a "Host Teacher" in the school.
- Each participant is given a daily timetable according to their Needs Analysis.
- Specific and generalist aims are catered for.

Clean Criminal Record

Visiting teachers need to show evidence of no criminal convictions.

Teachers may not enter a French school without this.

The Criminal Record should **not** be **more than 6 months old** on commencement of the course. Try to obtain an official copy in French.

If the Criminal Record is only in the native language, a French or English translation is needed, certified by the Head Teacher/Principal/Training Manager or other responsible person. They should write "I certify that this is a true translation of the original" and sign, date (and stamp if possible).
