#### **Course Topics**

## English language development

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#### **Course Content**

The morning classes cover all the language skills - speaking, listening, reading and writing as well as pronunciation, vocabulary and grammar activities. Class work includes individual, pair and group work, discussions, debates, project work, presentations, written tasks and listening exercises.

The afternoon input sessions focus on a range of current methodologies in practice and are a blend of lecture format and practical activities.

#### **Format**

A **1-week** course consisting of 28 classroom contact hours plus an afternoon trainer-led cultural programme designed to increase awareness of the wealth of locally available resources which can be incorporated into classroom teaching activities.
