Practical School Attachment preceded by Preparatory Course

This course is aimed at non-native speakers of German

- EPG4 <u>Students aged 11 18 (Secondary and Vocational Schools)</u>
- EPG5 Pupils aged 6 10 (Primary Schools)
- EPG6 Pupils/students aged 6 16 (Montessori Schools)

Particularly suitable for teachers of non-linguistic subjects (e.g. Maths, Science, P.E. etc.) Suitable for teachers of foreign languages, especially GFL teachers A unique and practical opportunity for the professional development of teachers of CLIL

Objectives

This course is aimed at providing non-native speakers of German with insights into their own and colleagues' teaching practice in a pan-European context by means of a oneweek practical attachment in an appropriate German school, preceded by a one-week course of linguistic/cultural preparation.

Methodology

1 week: Linguistic / Cultural Component: Interactive German language (classroom) sessions, combining a range of input modes, encouraging participants to contribute their own research and experience. Special session involving linguistic and cultural support for the School Attachment.

1 week: School Attachment: (5 full days per week, excluding Bank Holidays) - guided observations, attachment to the Host Teacher, directed tasks, team teaching and assignments.

School Attachment Specific Preparation

- Each Applicant completes a detailed Application Form including teaching background.
- Each Applicant completes a detailed professional Needs Analysis.
- Each Applicant completes a detailed Child Safeguarding and Identity Form
- Each Applicant obtains a copy of their national Criminal Record.
- Detailed written advice is given to the teacher on obtaining a copy of their Criminal Record.
- These details are sent to the Host School.
- Detailed written advice is given to the teacher on the School Attachment.
- Detailed written advice is given to the Host School (School Attachment)
- Great care and professional expertise is taken by Dialoge and the Host School in "matching" visiting teacher and host school.

Bi-Component Programme Support

- Each participant has a one-week Preparatory Course
- Each participant is given a personal Dialoge Tutor to prepare their School Attachment with cultural, educational and practical guidance.
- There is a "Training Officer" in the Attachment School. (Head /Assistant Head, Head of Department, International Officer or Training Manager)
- Each participant has a "Host Teacher" in the school.
- Each participant is given a daily timetable according to their Needs Analysis.
- Specific and generalist aims are catered for.

Clean Criminal Record

Visiting teachers need to show evidence of no criminal convictions.

Teachers may not enter a German school without this.

The Criminal Record should <u>not</u> be <u>more than 6 months old</u> on commencement of the course. Try to obtain an official copy in German/English.

If the Criminal Record is only in the native language, a German/English translation is needed, certified by the Head Teacher/Principal/Training Manager or other responsible person. They should write "I certify that this is a true translation in German/English of the original" and sign, date (and stamp if possible).
