ERASMUS+

This course is suitable for practising primary or secondary teachers (not mother-tongue speakers of Spanish) who wish:

- 1. to become teachers of Spanish or
- 2. to refresh their abilities to teach Spanish or
- 3. to train to teach another subject in Spanish

Due to the School Attachment participants must be native English speakers or Teachers of English with minimum B2 level of English.

The course aims to achieve these objectives by:

- Improving their knowledge of general Spanish (beginner upwards)
- Improving their knowledge of Spanish culture and traditions by participating in the cultural activities programme including cultural talks, film presentations, traditional dance etc
- Providing an insight into Spanish educational methods, styles and objectives through a week of daily "shadowing" in a local school and the consequent networking and peer sharing of knowledge

NB: participants must be either native-speakers of English or have at least a B2 level of English. The benefit to the hosting school for the attachment will be primarily through an enhanced English-speaking resource.

Objectives

The intention is to refresh the teaching skills of existing teachers of Spanish and/or to help in the re-training of teachers of other languages and other subjects and also to create opportunities for an international transfer of knowledge and skills through peer-networking during the Shadowing.

Week 1: General Spanish: from beginner upwards: this course involves small group teaching, allowing concentrated, thorough study of Spanish, and develops all aspects of the language - listening, speaking, reading and writing. The course will develop the participants' language skills to help increase their abilities to teach and communicate in Spanish.

Week 2: School Attachment: the participating teacher(s) will spend the 2nd week shadowing Spanish teachers in local schools. The hosting school will gain an extra English-speaking teaching resource while the participating teacher will gain an educationally enriching experience. Both parties will gain from the sharing of experiences and know-how.

Follow-up Spanish: each afternoon (week 2) the participant(s) will have 1 lesson of Spanish in which they will be able to cover linguistic items at their level which they have identified as hindering their Shadowing or which will generally improve their abilities in Spanish.

Spanish and Shadowing for Teachers

Week 1: General Spanish Course Areas

4 skills

The 4 skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening are all developed systematically through activities, games, role plays etc. Sometimes the approach is more traditional and direct, and sometimes it is more intuitive.

Grammar

We believe that a firm grasp of language structures and grammar is essential and that it also helps as a "signpost" to the student of their progress through their learning of the language.

Vocabulary

Our syllabus details the vocabulary items and areas which we teach at each level, integrated with the development of the 4 skills and grammatical knowledge.

Week 2: School Attachment

Each morning during the 2nd week of the programme you will shadow teachers in a local school. They will be interested in your English-speaking skills and also your teaching techniques. You will gain from the opportunity of seeing Spanish education in action and being able to compare this to how things are done at home.

Week 2: follow-up Spanish

During the $2^{\rm nd}$ week you will also have 1 Spanish lesson each afternoon in which you can focus on language items at your level which will help you gain more from the Shadowing or your course in general.

Cultural activities

In addition to aspects of Spanish culture included in the General Spanish classes, the teacher-participants can also participate in the following free of charge cultural activities, as well as others which may have a small charge:

- 2 flamenco classes per week
- 1 salsa class per week
- 1 film presentation per week
- 1 cultural talk per week

These all provide excellent extra potential classroom material.

Course Content and Strategies

Interested teachers who are not native speakers of English are tested at the time of booking to ensure they meet the B2 entry requirement in English.

Week 1: General Spanish: All areas of the Spanish language at each participant's specific level. There are a maximum of 10 per class. We have developed an eclectic teaching philosophy combining many aspects of the communicative approach with structured learning of grammar and syntax. Aspects of Spanish culture are introduced as appropriate.

Week 2: School Attachment: By helping a Spanish school teacher teach classes of English or in English, the teacher participants will gain an invaluable insight into teaching in Spain and an opportunity for professional networking and interchange of ideas and experiences. An excellent professionally and culturally enriching experience.

Week 2: Follow-up Spanish: additional Spanish focusing on areas at the participant's level which can enhance the Shadowing experience. In a class of 1-10 participants.
