French Language

Reading Skills...

A variety of reading activities is used to encourage students to develop the various reading skills that are needed to read effectively.

Writing Skills...

Writing will be utilised to develop accuracy. Writing activities may also be set for homework.

Listening Skills...

Listening skills will be practised extensively, using a variety of activities and tasks, to enable students to be able to process the information and become more confident in this skill.

Speaking Skills...

Speaking will be an integral part of lessons. Students are given the opportunity to express their ideas in a relaxed classroom atmosphere, by use of a range of activities to encourage communication.

Grammar Awareness...

Grammar for effective communication will be presented and practised at all levels.

Vocabulary...

Vocabulary is a key element in learning a foreign language. Various activities to encourage the acquisition of vocabulary are an integral part of the course.

Extra fluency practice...

Every afternoon 1 extra lesson in small groups. These thematic workshops focus on communication skills and phonetics.

Culture...

Our teaching materials draw on aspects of French life and culture from the very beginning. We also cover regional festivals, anniversaries of famous French artists, writers and singers etc

You will learn about France and the French way of life as you progress in your knowledge of the language.

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The overall approach in the language development classes is communicative with students encouraged and facilitated to use the language learned on the course. This covers all aspects of French language skills - speaking, listening, reading and writing as well as pronunciation, vocabulary and grammar activities. Class work includes individual, pair and group work, discussions, debates, roleplays, presentations, written tasks and listening exercises. Participants are actively encouraged to share their own ideas and experience in a friendly, supportive atmosphere while developing networks with other international students.

In morning classes, linguistic topics and structures are introduced to the class each week. The afternoon classes provide and enhance participants' key skills in communication and all classes are taught with reference to cultural topics such as The Region of the Month, The Author of the Month and so on...

Participants receive focused feedback thanks to a personal pedagogic dashboard which is filled in every week together with the teacher. Participants have regular tutorials with their teachers to discuss progress and ways to maximise their learning while reviewing objectives and setting homework if necessary. Areas for improvement are addressed through revision sessions, progress tests and additional language and cultural workshops.
