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Course Topics

Intensive English

The key concept is communication. We use task based, collaborative and humanistic approaches to create a positive learning environment where the focus is on practical classroom activities. CLIL - Module

Teachers will be given opportunities to design material and reflect on the different task types. Key to this is also learning how to select from existing material and adapt according to their learners' needs. We look at scaffolding tools for best practices

Course Content and Strategies

Intensive English

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CLIL - Module

During the training, participants will explore the principles behind Content and Language Integrated learning (CLIL) while improving their English language skills so that they will gain the confidence and understanding of how to combine language and subject teaching within a practical lesson framework.

We will be selecting an appropriate topic, and, through solo, pair and group tasks plan stimulating activities that impart the learning of both content and language. Participants will explore a wide variety of practical task types and activities which they can put into immediate use in their own classroom.
